

## CHECKLIST OF THE DRAGONFLIES AND DAMSELFLIES OF VIRGINIA

Virginia is host to one of the most diverse Odonata (dragonfly and damselfly) faunas of any state or province in North America. The following checklist of 144 dragonflies and 55 damselflies includes all species that have been documented to occur in Virginia. The common names adopted by the Dragonfly Society of the Americas are followed except as noted parenthetically. Capitalized names are the scientific Family names. The abundance column (rare, uncommon or common) refers to the status of each species in Virginia. Many of the species listed as "rare" are more common in neighboring states but reach either their northern or southern range limit in Virginia. Species listed as historical have not been documented in the state in the past 40 years. Species first found in Virginia after 2000 are denoted by asterisks.
